Dear Mr. Rajamäe!

Finding in the newspaper your address, I directly make use of it in writing you. I am living in Geistlingen with my family, in the biggest Estonian Camp. In three parts of the town there have been taken for the Estonians about 180 houses, one schoolhouse and one theatre-building.

My wife is employed as a teacher, and my son attends the first class of the elementary-school.

Mr. Märt Ulu is living in Bavaria (Bayer), Gunzenhausen, and there are living still Mr. Peep Remma with his wife and Mr. Paul Hergmann. About Mrs. Vitut I have no informations. If you should have the possibility to get any informations would you kindly tell me if there are in Sweden. Mr. Julius Raudve with his wife Helhelmine (teacher

in Järva-Jaani), teacher Maria Tamme (Ferdinand Tamme is in the warprisoner's Camp at Munich). Mr. Johan Nages with his wife Alice (who was at the administration of the counties). Their son Heinz is here).

We have heard that Sweden consents to accept Estonian emigrants. Is there any real foundation in this rumour and could we build up any future hopes on it.

If your material position allows it, please could you buy and send me an English-Estonian and Estonian-English dictionary.

Here nothing of this kind has been given out. We are not allowed to write in Estonian from here to Sweden, while from there letters in Estonian have come.
