‘Wonder twins’ break GCSE¹ records

‘Wonder twins’ Peter and Paula Imafidon have set a GCSE record today after 60 different schools, some of them amongst the best of the country, invited the twins to continue their studies there.

But it’s an all-girls school and it would be great if me and Peter could go to the same school. We need to see which one could maybe accommodate the both of us and have the subjects that we want to study.”

As for the future, both stated their intent to focus on maths and sciences first, but the two differed over what they wanted to study at university.

“I’m more of a maths and physics based guy,” said Peter. “I’m hoping to study engineering at university.” Paula expressed her desire to study medicine.

Having spent years studying and playing sport together, the twins openly admitted to the long-running rivalry between them.

Paula said: “It’s not only just the academic side that we compete over but it’s also music and sport. That’s why we really want to go to the same school so we can continue that competition.”

Peter echoed his sister and said: “I definitely feel that everything between Paula and me is some sort of competition. We are both competitive and especially while playing hockey against each other in the Wednesday league. I feel that it’s something that has been transferred from sports to academia.”
